Meals on Wheels provides fresh, delicious meals that are cooked daily within our own office. Our kitchen staff is dedicated to offering the best tasting food we can deliver by developing their own twists for classic



plates like Chicken Parmesan, Cabbage Rolls and Pan Seared Perch, as well creating unique servings such as Sue's famous Lasagna Soup. By delivering **18,627 meals** last year alone, we helped an average of **120 clients per month** maintain their independence within their own homes.







ACS is one of 7 agencies that have teamed up to provide the CareLink Health Transit; a simplified and integrated system that makes it easy for residents to find and utilize accessible transportation. We operate



five days a week and provide transportation to seniors and adults with temporary or permanent disabilities for medical appointments, social outings, shopping trips and much more. Last year, we provided nearly **7000 rides** and **travelled almost 80,000 kms.**

The Friendly Social Seniors Congregate Dining

Meeting twice a month, the Friendly Social Seniors' Congregate Dining group is a constant reminder that age is just a number. The program provides an exciting way for seniors to meet new people and reduce the risk of isolation and loneliness. Now 40 regular members strong with **over 500 meals served last year**, the fun never stops.

Friendly Visiting & Social Reassurance

As we age, it is easy for feelings of loneliness to creep in, while living alone can create dangerous challenges and hazards. The Friendly Visiting program pairs volunteers with seniors to ensure that everyone in our community has a friend. The Social Reassurance program provides seniors with regular check-ups over the phone to provide peace of mind that someone is looking out for them and to offer a friendly conversation.

Stuff-a-Stocking

The Holidays are a time for giving, but too often the elderly in our community are overlooked. The annual Stuff-a-Stocking program ensures that every senior gets a gift that reminds them that they have their entire community behind them. Not only did we provide more stockings this year than ever before, the support we received from the community in the way of donations and volunteering was unprecedented.



Fill-a-Backpack Program

Every year, we work to provide local children with the right tools to succeed in school. We believe every child deserves the same opportunities for success, and no financial situation should hinder that. Last year, we provided **105 backpacks** filled with school supplies to local children.

Secret Santa

2016 saw the return of the Mealtime Express Secret Santa program in Amherstburg after a 7-year hiatus. Owners Norm and Janet Mickle approached us to help promote and operate the program, alongside the Amherstburg Police Service. The partnership was able to supply toys to nearly **50 children**.



Recreation Subsidy Programs

Sports and other activities are vital to the development of children, however registration fees are often an obstacle for struggling families to overcome. By working with Canadian Tire Jumpstart and Pathway to Potential's Recreation Subsidy program, we distributed **over \$70,000** to help cover these costs.





Coats for Kids

ACS is proud to have worked with the Unemployed Help Centre of Windsor for 17 years to distribute winter clothing to children and families in Windsor-Essex. Last year, we helped distribute over **150 winter coats** and other types winter clothing to families in need.



Service Canada

Our office is a proud satellite location for Service Canada in Amherstburg. The government organization uses our office on the first Tuesday of each month to provide a convenient place for rural residents in the western half of Essex County to access important services such as the Canada Pension Plan, Employment Insurance, SIN, the Electronic Job Bank, and much more. Over the past year, **443 people accessed these services**.



Keep the Heat and OESP

As energy prices continue to rise in Ontario, the choices that families in our region are forced to make become more and more difficult. Through our partnerships with the Unemployed Help Centre and the Housing Information Services, we work with families to register for the Keep the Heat program, which provides financial support for heating costs. We provide support for households looking to access the Ontario Energy Support Program, which assists low-income households by providing energy discounts. In all, **we helped 453 people** find support for their energy and heating bills.


